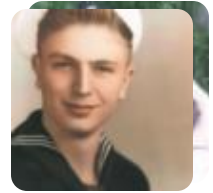
Bud Fouts posted:

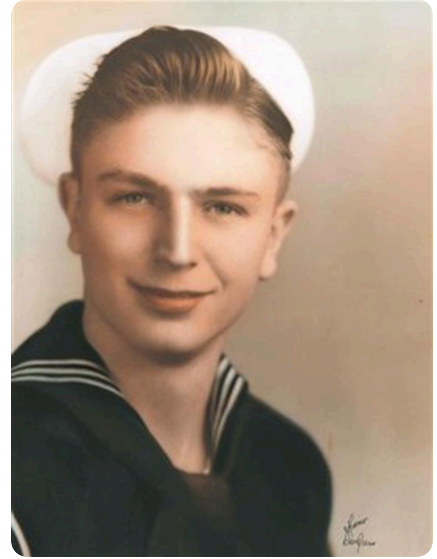
