**M**ozella Magnolia Curry Langham was born on August 17, 1950, in Boswell, Oklahoma to Raymond and Naomi Curry. Mozella was one of six children. She fought a long hard and tremendous battle with illnesses, and never lost her faith. She departed this life on June 9, 2018, at Madigan Army Medical center in Tacoma, Washington. Mozella's parents preceded her in death. She accepted Christ as her Lord and Savior at the age of 15 years old in 1965, in Bluff, Oklahoma.

She attended South Seattle Community College in March 1973, where she met her wonderful husband, Edgar (Ed) Langham JR. In July 1974, they were married. To this union, God blessed Mozella and Ed with two children, Derick A. and Demetric L. Langham.

Mozella worked for Puget Sound Bank, before Key Bank for 22 years, as an adjustment specialist. But her passion was for cooking and spending time with her family. 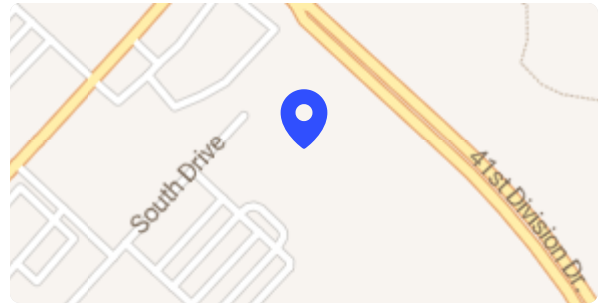

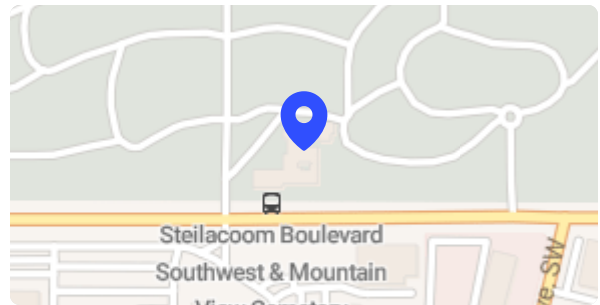
