Joe was a proud member of the U.S. Army for 27 years. He served in WWII, the Korean War and the War in Vietnam. Joe was a decorated hero, receiving many commendations including the WWII Victory Medal, Legion of Merit, Vietnam Service Medal and Bronze Star. Upon JoeÃ,'s retirement at the rank of Lt. Colonel, the family settled in Lakewood, WA, where he pursued careers in the insurance and then construction fields. Joe is survived by his beloved wife of 57 years, Lois; children Cathy (Bill) Savage, Marie (Bill) Spencer, John Coonan and David (Tracy) Coonan; grandchildren Jillian, Ryan and Jenna Savage, Jeff (Kim) Evans and Sarah Spencer, Katie, Matthew and Danica Coonan, Danny and Kyle Coonan and great-grandsons Matthew Evans and Samuel Spencer.
