Due to just having open heart surgery to repair a valve, I wont be able to attend my sisters funeral so I am going to say here what I would tell everyone there about her. Judy had taught me how to crochet when I was only 7 and that was just the beginning of my arts and crafts career along with her and Beth Todd. My sister always walked through life, without ever feeling sorry for herself. I have some of the most hilarious memories of my sister...mostly the ones where she always would want me to imitate the Korean Man and his wife that would come into Costco. They spoke only 5 words of English: "You charga me too much!" Over and over again. Sometimes she would laugh so hard that she would actually lose her teeth. I remember the time when i was probably 13 and we went to spend a week with Aunt Ardith over the summer. Her son Paul was the biggest joker, and thought it was so funny to wait till Judy would get in the water (we swam in the river)then he would catch a water snake and let it loose across the top of the river...as soon as she saw that snake skimming towards her and me..Yikes! she was out of that water so fast that one time she ripped the side of her black and white one piece suit, or he would turn on the electric fence and shock her. She was one of the funnest people to go to a really funny movie (like "9 to 5") with because she would laugh so hard that the audience would end up laughing at her instead of the movie. Did it embarrass me? No, that was the fun of going with her. She loved to go to the Puyallup fair and eat scones.....who didn't. I remember the year they went up from .15 cents to .20, and you would have thought the roller coaster had burned down. She was so talented in both crochet and plastic canvas that she made hundreds of baby blankets and aphysans over the years, that i think everyone that ever knew her and had had a baby, they had one of her blankets. My sister and I both had shared the friendship of one of the most incredible people in the world; Beth Todd. Beth taught my sister almost as much as me when it came to crafts. She was my Sisters Red Hat Mother(that is like the Grand Duchess!) and they were inseperable, i know that Beth is losing one of if not her best friend. Judy had 3 kids that were all very special to me. My nieces Darlene, Kimberly and nephew Steven will all (i am sure) remember what i am talking about. They will learn how to accept to talk to their Mom in their hearts and minds and they will learn how to find and accept her responses. I believe that they will have their mother anytime that they want her.
