John H. Monroe was born to the late Jesse Monroe and Janie Shaw on October 25, 1921 in Kingstree, SC. On August 17, 2011 he peacefully passed away at American Lake VA Hospital in Washington.

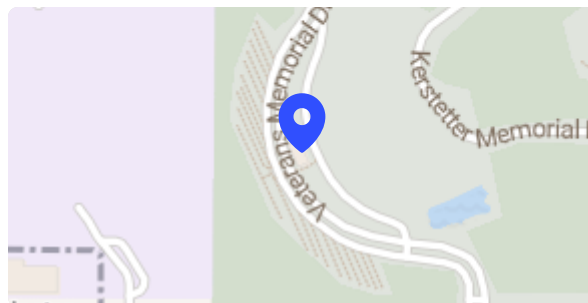
